## Jason's Journal

*"I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me."  
John 17:20-21*

A little less than 20 years ago Reverend Barrett Alewine and the leadership of St. Mark United Methodist Church gave to me, your associate pastor at the time, the instruction and the opportunity to try to begin a contemporary worship service. I remember that day like yesterday; needless to say I was afraid of the daunting task. We began the service with roughly 40 people in the small building behind the Bypass Campus, what we now refer to as The Gathering Place, but was then known as The Scout Hut as it was used to host Boy Scout troop gatherings. In the planning stages, implementation, and beginning of the service not everyone was in agreement of

beginning a third service; yet we were unified in the purpose of why to begin the new service - to offer an alternate style of worship to hopefully reach more people with the good news of Jesus.

Within a year, by God's grace, the service had out grown the small building and we began searching for ways to continue the growing service in other locations. The Rivers Street property became available for purchase and the people of St. Mark United Methodist Church rallied to begin the hard work of cleaning and preparing that space to become what it is today. While there were some who did not agree with the purchase, wondering how we would pay for it or why purchase it in the first place or the fear that it would divide the church, there was a call to be unified in purpose and committed to another way to share the good news of Jesus to all people. In addition, as for the concern of division in the church, a church is only divided when a mindset of division is present.

Fast forward 14 to 15 years later and the young man that St. Mark United Methodist Church trained to be a pastor returned home as their senior pastor. I remember meeting with the SPRC for the introductory visit and one of the items shared with Amber and me that evening over dinner and conversation was the need for St. Mark to be unified. I remember after officially being appointed to St. Mark having listening sessions with Sunday school classes and small groups and hearing again the need for unity in the church. Most recently, some of the feedback given to our Forward Focus team indicated a need for unity between the two campuses and four worship services. The feedback sounded much like an 'us versus them' mentality. St. Mark, as one of your pastors, I say this with much love in my heart for you and great appreciation for each of you; if there is an 'us versus them' mentality in any of us, I can assure you that it is not of God the Father, the Son, or the Holy Spirit.

The above passage of Scripture from John's Gospel chapter 17 is Jesus' last prayer recorded in John's Gospel. While we do not call this prayer The Lord's Prayer, this is truly the prayer of our Lord. In John 17:20-21 Jesus is praying specifically for all who will come to believe in him through the witness of Jesus' original disciples. To put it plainly, Jesus was praying for you and for me the night Jesus was betrayed, arrested, and put on trial. The night before Jesus was arrested, Jesus was praying for us. What did Jesus pray for? Jesus prayed for us to be unified or to be one so that the world may believe in Jesus.

I share all of this with you out of a deep love and care for you. While we may not always agree, and that is okay, we are called to be unified in our purpose and mission; we are to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. By God's grace we are called to love boldly, serve joyfully, and lead courageously in the world around us. When the pastors, staff, and church leadership talk about St. Mark United Methodist Church as One Church with two campuses, while we may be in two different worship spaces with different styles of worship we have the common goal for the common good, to share the life transforming message of Jesus. St. Mark United Methodist Church is One Church with one mission. We are One Church with one budget for the same mission. We are One Church, all gifted by the Holy Spirit for the common good of showing and sharing Jesus to all people. I pray we cling to and intently strive to be one so that the world may believe in Jesus.

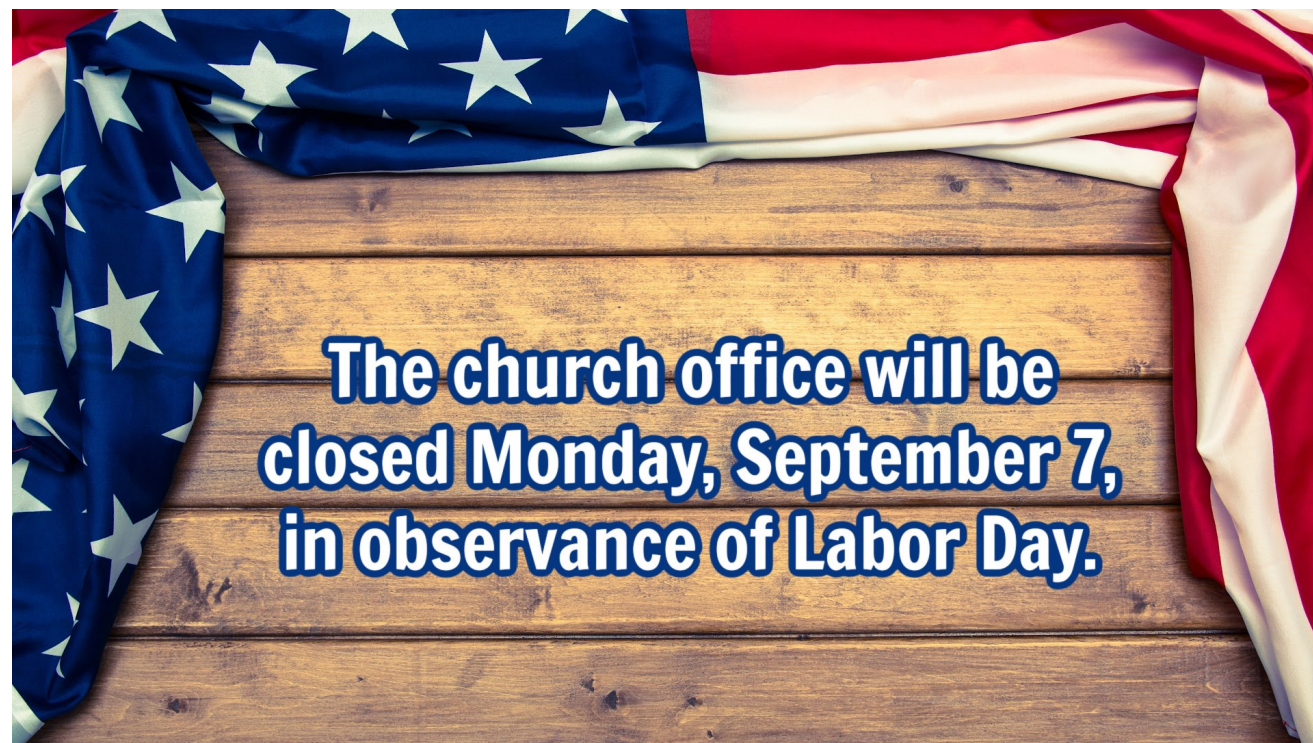

Hello St. Mark Family!

We say it often at St. Mark, “One Church.” But what exactly does that mean? St. Mark is a little unusual. We are one church with two campuses and four worship services. We worship in different places, at different times, and in different ways. Because of that, I have been thinking a lot lately about what it really means for us to call ourselves “One Church.”

Does being one church mean we have to do everything together? Does everything have to look the same at both campuses? Does every ministry have to happen in both places?

I don’t think it does.

I think being “One Church” is less about uniformity and more about shared identity. The comparison that came to my mind comes from my background in the hospitality industry. Think about Marriott. You can walk into Marriott properties in different cities and immediately recognize that they are part of the same organization. They share a common identity, standards, mission, vision, leadership structure, resources, and expectations. But no one expects a Marriott in downtown Atlanta to operate exactly like a resort property in Florida. The people are different. The communities are different. The buildings are different. The needs are different. The opportunities are different. Yet they are unmistakably part of the same organization.

Obviously, the church is much more than a hotel company, but I think the principle can help us understand something important about St. Mark. We have one mission. We have one vision. We have one church leadership structure. We share resources. We share ministries. We share staff. We share a name and an identity. Most importantly, we share the same calling to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We are not two separate churches that happen to have the same name. We are one St. Mark family.

But being one family doesn’t mean everything has to look exactly the same. Our campuses serve different communities and have developed different personalities. The people God has placed around each campus are different. The opportunities for ministry can be different. Even the ways we worship are different. Rather than seeing those differences as something that threatens our unity, maybe we can begin to see them as one of our greatest strengths.

Each campus can ask the same question: “How can St. Mark best fulfill our mission here?” Sometimes the answer will be the same at both campuses. Sometimes it won’t. But whatever we do should always flow from who we are together as St. Mark. There should absolutely be things we do together. We need opportunities to worship together (One Church Services), serve together (Community Care Dare, etc.), celebrate together, fellowship together, and remember that the people worshipping at the other campus are part of our church family. Those moments matter. They remind us that our church is bigger than the service we attend on Sunday morning.

I think the same principle can apply to Jason and I, as your pastors. We have one pastoral team serving one St. Mark, but that doesn't necessarily mean both of us have to be in every place. There is tremendous value in having a consistent pastoral presence at each campus. Relationships are built through presence. Pastors get to know the people they worship with, understand the unique needs of that congregation and community, walk alongside families through life, and help develop leaders. That doesn't divide our pastoral team or our church. It allows us as your pastors to shepherd one church effectively in two locations, while continuing to work together as one pastoral team responsible for the ministry of all of St. Mark. That doesn't change that Jason is the Senior Pastor and that I am the Associate Pastor. What it does it allows us to better care for the congregation of St. Mark.

But our oneness isn't measured by how often we are physically in the same room. Neither is it measured by whether the calendars at our two campuses look exactly alike. Maybe a good way to think about it is this: Together where unity matters. Local where context matters. One mission. One vision. One family. Two places where God has given us the opportunity to share the Gospel, love our neighbors, serve our communities, and make disciples of Jesus Christ.

So perhaps the question we should ask isn't, "Are both campuses doing the same thing?" Maybe the better question is, "Are both campuses moving toward the same mission?" Because at the end of the day, whether you worship at RSC or Bypass, whether your service is contemporary or traditional, whether you have been here for decades or walked through our doors for the first time last Sunday, you are part of St. Mark.

One family.  
One mission.  
One Church.
